The project Harbor Heritage Story Telling aims at:

- Identifying and enhancing the hidden heritage of harbor, with and for the local residents and professionals
- Creating local networks of professional and volunteers who contribute to the port activity and will become ambassadors of Harbor Heritage
- Strengthening their social and heritage skills to develop and manage multi-thematic discovery paths, offering these cities a more attractive character

The project intends to raise the issues that tourism professionals in port areas are facing today, such as the lack of tools to better identify and promote unknown cultural assests, to better attract visitors, and to ensure additional tourim activity together with a long-term preservation and enhancement of local heritage.

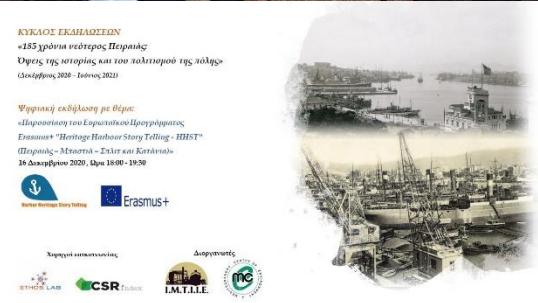
Participatory Heritage Workshops

The workshops are tools developed and promoted by the project with the aim of involving communities in locating and improving the hidden heritage of the port!

Since the winter of 2020, similar actions have been developed in the cities of the partners participating in the project.

The COVID pandemic did not always allow partners to organize face-to-face meetings and discussions, but the workshops found a way to open the discussion, gather new information about the ports' cultural heritage and organize new tours in the city of Bastia (Corsica-FR), Piraeus (Attic-GR), Split (Dalmatia-HR) and Catania (Sicilia-IT).
